## Green Events Connect KIB, Community

One of Keep Irving Beautiful's most popular programs is called "Green Events." Chances are you have been to an event in Irving where you saw recycling stations set up around the grounds with signs in English and Spanish that encouraged attendees to throw trash and recyclables in their proper containers. Those signs let you know that you were attending an "Official KIB Green Event," or "Evento Verde Oficial." Green Events are a great way for KIB to partner with other groups who want their activities to be environmentally friendly, and who want to leave a location as clean (or cleaner!) than they found it. Some are large-scale city events such as Community Fest, or events with local partners like the Irving YMCA's Fall Festival. We have also provided supplies for fun runs and triathlons, conferences like the recent Heartland Ministries "Collision" youth gathering, as well as smaller events like neighborhood association block parties. Green Event supplies can be borrowed from KIB by calling the office at 972-721-2175.

This month we are focusing on a special partner, the **Irving Animal Care Campus**, which shares a facility with the DFW Humane Society. KIB was there at their Grand Opening in 2010, and has continued to partner with them for numerous green events. The yearly "Pet Pawloosa" in March is always a green event thanks to this partnership. Coming up this month on **August 15** is "**Clear the Shelters**" where the adoption fee is absolutely free for all spayed or neutered animals! This follows last

year's successful "Empty the Shelter" event, which Irving spearheaded, involving shelters all across the Metroplex. You are very likely to find that perfect feline or canine companion, and while you are there, be sure that your recyclable materials go into KIB's green event containers. The event is from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. at 4140 Valley View Lane. - Dog waste makes up a large percentage of the waste stream in parks. "Do the right thing" by picking up after your dog, and using biodegradable waste bags
