7 p.m. July 1:

The 36th Infantry Division Band will play on Irving City Hall's east lawn, [825 W. Irving Blvd.](#) The 90-minute concert will feature the 36th Infantry Division's Rhythm and Boots Big Classic Jazz Band and the Concert Band. Concert admission and parking are free.

9 a.m. July 4:

The Irving Independence Day Parade and Reception offers floats, high school bands and more at the city's annual parade. This year's parade theme is "Music of America." Parade participants will distribute candy to visitors along the parade route. A watermelon reception will follow from 10 a.m. to noon at Heritage Park, [217 S. Main St.](#), live music and children's activities also will be available. Admission and parking are free. Unite for the Troops will collect letters and donations for deployed troops. 6 p.m. July 4:

The City of Irving's Fireworks Show will run from 6 to 10 p.m. July 4 at Levy Event Plaza, [501 E. Las Colinas Blvd.](#) Admission is free. Garage parking is available for \$10. **Only cash will be accepted.** The evening will have live music from "[The Powell Brothers](#)" and "[Downtown Fever Band](#)." Additionally, there will be children activities and 18 food vendors. Residents are encouraged to bring blankets and lawn chairs for seating. The fireworks display will begin at 9:30 p.m.
