COUNCIL RESOLUTION NO. 4-22-97-275

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WHEREAS, City Council wishes to make Irving a better, cleaner, more aesthetically pleasing and safer place in which to live and work for all of its citizens; and

WHEREAS, City Council encourages each and every citizen to help meet this goal; and

WHEREAS, there have been situations in which compliance with minimum code standards has not been voluntary and there will likely be more such situations in which codes must be enforced; and

WHEREAS, codes must be enforced uniformly and equally; and

WHEREAS, this City Council wishes to insure that codes are enforced uniformly and equally; and

WHEREAS, in order to insure that codes are enforced uniformly and equally, this City Council wishes to establish a policy of non-interference that will be a guide for all City Councils in the enforcement of codes;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF IRVING, TEXAS:


SECTION I. THAT the City Council hereby establishes a policy of non-interference from individual members relative to the abatement of code enforcement.

SECTION II. THAT should an individual member of the City Council request a member of the City of Irving staff to abate a code enforcement action, staff is hereby directed to place the matter on the next City Council agenda to determine whether the code enforcement action should be abated.


SECTION III. THAT this resolution shall take effect from and after its final date of passage, and it is accordingly so ordered.


