Lifeguard at one of the City of Irving's pools or aquatic centers.

Are you considering a career in the medical or emergency response sectors? Or perhaps you are interested in the fitness or recreation fields? Need flexible hours or a job close to home? Consider what employment with the city as a lifeguard can offer, including:

- First Aid / CPR / AED certification
- Obtain Water Rescue skills
- Increased leadership opportunities
- Improve decision-making skills
- Development of public relations, customer service and conflict-resolution skills
- Verifiable work experience for résumés and college applications

Lifeguard applicants must be 16 years old and be able to swim. American Red Cross lifeguard certification is required before employment; classes are offered through the City of Irving. Scholarships are available on a case-by-case basis to help defray the cost of classes.

Lifeguard certification candidates will be challenged to demonstrate creativity, courage and determination. Successful completion of the course provides students with **American Red Cross Lifeguard/First Aid, CPR-Professional Rescuer and AED certifications.**
