

# Getting started with EBSCO eBooks

The EBSCO eBook collection contains full-text scholarly, reference and professional eBooks to be downloaded and read on a computer or mobile device.

## Web Access

These instructions apply to devices accessing EBSCO eBooks through a web browser. EBSCO offers apps for Android and Apple devices. See the specific instructions for more information.

1. Visit <http://cityofirving.org/2790> and hover over the **Books and More** tab, under **Digital Downloads** (right side) click on the **EBSCO eBooks** link. On this page click on the link for the **EBSCO eBooks Collection Home Page**.
2. Enter your 14-digit Irving Public Library card number and your PIN and click **Login**.
3. To find available titles:
  - Browse **Latest Issues** and **All Magazines** carousel on the home page
  - Browse by **Categories** on the left side of the home page
  - Or **Search for Titles** at the top of the page by entering a title, subject or keyword
4. When you find a title that you wish to borrow, click **PDF Full Text** to begin reading the text in your browser.
5. Or click the **Download (Offline)** to check-out and download the eBook for offline reading. Once you select **Download (Offline)** it will prompt you to log in to My EBSCOhost.
  - Your EBSCOhost folder is your personal account. If you do not have an account set up already, you will need to click **Create a new Account** and go through the steps to create your personal EBSCOhost account.
6. **NOTE:** In order to download eBooks, you must have Adobe Digital Editions 1.7.1 or higher installed on your computer.
7. Select a **Checkout period** from the drop-down menu and click the **Checkout & Download** button.
  - For some titles, you may see the option to select either the PDF or ePub format for an eBook
8. The eBook is added to the Checkout area of the folder, accessible from the upper-right corner of the EBSCOhost interface.
9. Select to **Open** or **Save** the file from the resulting dialog box.
  - If you **Open** the file, your eBook is opened with Adobe® Digital Editions.
  - If you **Save** the file, the eBook is saved to your computer and can be opened with Adobe® Digital Editions at a later time.
