Mr. Victor Ostrand passed away at 3:30 o'clock Tuesday afternoon at the home of his sister, Mrs. Emma Foss, 3509 Swiss Avenue Dallas.

Mr. Ostrand had been in declining health for four years and bedfast for two months.

Funeral services were held at the Baptist Church at 2:30 Wednesday afternoon, conducted by the local minister. Interment was in the Kit Cemetery.

Mr. Ostrand was born in Sweden sixty-four years ago. He came to the United States at the age of three and was a pioneer citizen of Irving. He was a man of few words, of quiet and unassuming habits.
