

Irving Youth Killed

An Irving youth, Thomas Leroy Carley, 16, was killed instantly Friday night when a .30 .30 rifle which was being cleaned discharged. Justice of the Peace D. E. Sherman of Centerville, Leon County, ruled accidental death.

The Carley youth, son of Mr. and Mrs. T. L. Carley of 504 King Richard Dr., and two other Irving boys, Ronly Tucker and Kenneth Foster, were at a camp site about eight miles from Centerville when the shooting occurred about 9:30 p.m.

The boys, cleaning their guns, were preparing to go hunting Saturday morning, according to Leon County Sheriff Ben Lee.

Last rites are set Monday, 3 p.m. in Blacks Chapel. Survivors besides parents are three brothers, Dewey, Ricky, and Mark Carley.
