

Racugno, 59, Dies Of Heart Attack

-- Carlos Thomas Racugno, 59, Wednesday died of a heart attack at his home, 6800 Pipe Line Road in North Richland Hills. He was stricken at 9 p.m. and was rushed to Harris Hospital in Fort Worth where he was pronounced dead on arrival.

'Last Ride' Victim

Found Near Irving

DALLAS (UPI) -- John Arthur Reese, a 35-year-old police character, was found shot to death in old-time gangland "last ride" style early Tuesday near Irving.

His body, nearly cut in half by a fusillade of .30 caliber rifle shots fired point-blank, was found on a gravel road in northwest Dallas County.

Sheriff Bill Decker said Reese was an ex-convict with a long arrest record. The sheriff said Reese apparently was driven to the rural area and shot 15 times as he stood in the middle of the road. Reese clutched two marijuana cigarettes in one hand, Decker said. Six empty cartridge casings were found near the body.

The body was discovered shortly after dawn by R. C. Phelps, 47, who was walking to his job on a nearby ranch.

Racer Dies After Crash

PARIS (UPI) -- Peter Ryan, 21, of Mont Tremblant, Quebec, died Monday of injuries received when his racing car somersaulted off the track in a qualification run Sunday at Rheims.

"We did everything which was humanly possible to do," said the doctor who treated the young Canadian at Cochin Hospital here where he died. "There was nothing to be done."

At Ryan's bedside when he died was his mother, who had come here by plane as soon as she heard of the accident. Ryan and his mother operated a ski resort at Mont Tremblant and he was widely known both as a skier and a racing driver.

Ryan was brought to Paris this morning from Rheims by a U.S. Air Force plane. However, doctors at Cochin Hospital found he was suffering from multiple fractures of the pelvic and hip bones as well as other internal injuries.

Ryan was taken first to the Rheims Hospital and received several blood transfusions.
