Tiny Boy Caught In Bed Spring

Nine-month-old Jerry Ross Northcut was pronounced dead on arrival at the Professional Center Hospital about 7 a.m. Monday.

Justice of the Peace Lloyd Russell held an inquest and pronounced the infant's death accidental due to suffocation.

According to police reports by Officers Bill McKee and John McCabe, the father, E. L. Northcut of 502 Sandra St., rushed the infant to the hospital after he was discovered wedged between his baby bed and the wall.

The father told police that the child had been placed in the bed of his niece, 14-year-old Margaret Nicholson, about 12:30 a.m. The girl awoke about 2:30 and moved the child to his baby bed on the west side of the girl's own bed near the wall.

The child's father and the father's brother-in-law, Delton Nicholson, discovered the infant just before 7 a.m. with discoloration on his body. He was rushed to Professional Center Hospital where mouth-to-mouth respiration aid was given along with other acts of an emergency nature to revive the child.

McCabe said the baby's bed had some screws loose on the side rail and it allowed the mattress and springs to fall down on one side. The baby apparently slid between the springs and side rails on the side of the bed next to the wall, catching his chin on edge of springs and forcing the back of his head against the side rails.

In his police report, McCabe said the child had a bruise on the right rear side of his head, a small bump just above the mark, another one-inch bruise on left rear side and two three-inch marks under his chin. He also said the front left shoulder and neck and side of the baby's face were discolored.

Northcut told the News Texan he had been living with his sister and brother-in-law for the past month. His wife is in a hospital suffering from a nervous disorder. The couple have one other child, a boy, Jack, age 3.

Black's Funeral Home is in charge of arrangements for the funeral. Services will be held at 3 p.m. Tuesday in Emory, Texas.

Northcut is employed at the Plastic Manufacturing Co. in Dallas.

Other survivors include a paternal grandparent, Jack R. Northcut of Dallas.
