An Irving man, Richard Anthony Rancier, 25, of 440 W. Sixth St., was among three persons known killed in the rash of a light aircraft in Tyler early this morning.

According to a Department of Public Safety spokesman, Rancier, George Hand, 35, of Richardson, and a woman who was still unidentified at 6 a.m., were killed when the plane they were in over-

ran the runway at Pounds Field in Tyler. The spokesman said the plane, believed to be a Beechcraft, was coming in for a landing around 1:30 a.m. and was in radio contact with the tower.

However, the craft overran the field by 200 feet, crashed and burst into flames. Pilot of the plane was still unknown at mid-morning today, the DPS spokesman said.
