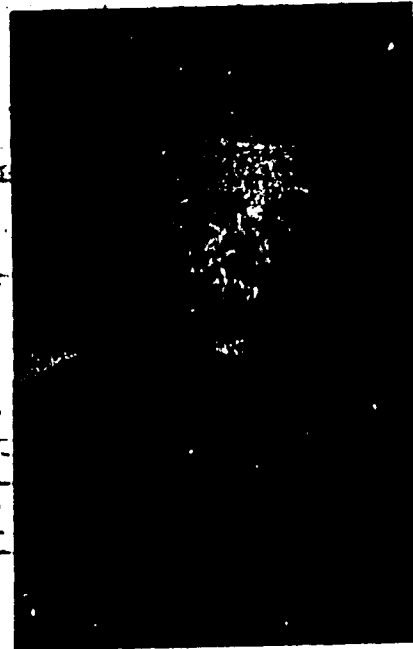
Miss Nell Goodloe, 64, of 1300 Ronnie, a counselor at MacArthur High School, died in a Lubbock hospital Oct. 14.
