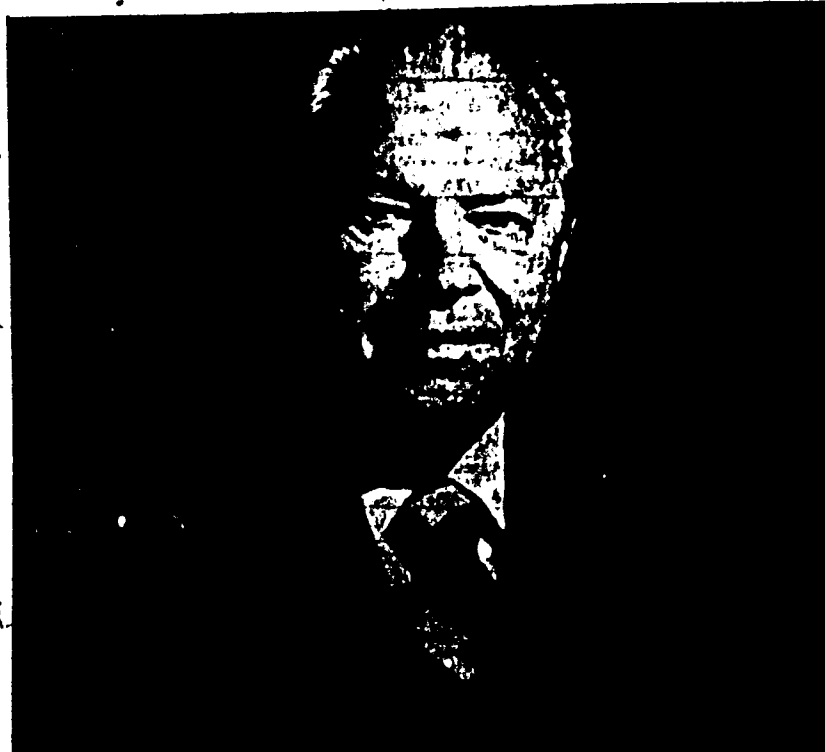
Mr. Schnee was on the board of directors of Texas Commerce Bank-Irving and was associated with many trade organizations.
