Deaths ruled murder-suicide

TEXARKANA (UPI) — The shooting deaths at the city water treatment plant of two model employees who were "the best of friends" were ruled murder-suicide, police said today.

Detective Bill Sams said he received word from the Dallas County medical examiner's office that Rex

Drew, 26, was shot to death Tuesday night by fellow employee Larry Douglas, 32, who then shot himself to death with a .38-caliber weapon.

Their bodies were found at about 11:14 p.m. Tuesday in a restroom at the water treatment plant where the men had worked the night shift together for the past three years, said

water utilities director Roger Ford.

Sams said today investigators still had no clue what led to the shootings.

"Everybody's got a theory," Sams said. "They were supposed to be the best of friends and model employees."
