Man faces another murder charge

GEORGE TUCKER A 46 year old Temple man convicted last week of murdering his daughter's lesbian lover and then skipping out temporarily on his bond was sentenced Thursday to 25 years in prison. "Good luck to you," Williamson County District Court Judge William C. Oldham told Tuck after imposing the sentence recommended last week by a jury.

Tuck said he planned to appeal his conviction for the July 1983 shooting death of Debra Linn, 29. He still faces attempted murder charges in the slaying of his daughter, Debbie Tuck, 22.

Tuck failed to appear at a punishment hearing on June 14 and was arrested later that night at a Caldwell motel.

He was again handed after telephoning an Austin newspaper reporter to report on a inmate suicide. The reporter turned him in to police. He said July 11 he considered whether to indict Tuck on the charge of kidnapping, a felony for which he could receive another 10-year term.

Irving man killed in Dallas accident

Dallas police said a hit-and-run driver killed a 21-year-old Irving man after striking his motorcycle on Loop 12 just north of Interstate 30 at 10 p.m. Sunday.

Dennis Keeton of the 1300 block of East Shady Grove Road was pronounced dead at 10:53 p.m. at Park-

land Memorial Hospital.

Keeton was traveling on his motorcycle east on Loop 12, according to police, near the intersection with Wardsworth in Dallas. A car traveling north on Wardsworth failed to yield the right of way, police said, and pulled in front of Keeton. Keeton struck the left front of the car but maintained control of the vehicle and pulled onto the median. Police said he then stepped into

the northbound traffic and was struck and tossed over one car and hit by several others.

Keeton suffered massive internal injuries, police said. They said no charges will be filed against the man who struck Keeton but they are still looking for the man who first hit his motorcycle.
