Benbrook girl's attorney to appeal

FORT WORTH (UPI) — An attorney who points to testimony that an institution would be harmful to his client, plans to appeal a sentence that may keep a 12-year-old girl in the care of the state for more than five years.

Judge Scott Moore announced Wednesday that a 12-year-old Benbrook girl, convicted of delinquency-involuntary manslaughter in the shotgun slaying of her best friend,

should be given to the care of the Texas Youth Commission.

Attorney Harold Calvin Ray described the sentence as "the harshest extreme possible. It is contrary to the advice of two psychiatrists, one that was appointed by the court and one for the defense. But they reached the same conclusion, that it would be adverse to place her in an institution."

"Everything that could be nor-

mality in her life, she's being sent away from it," said Ray, who said he planned to file an appeal Friday to try to keep his client from being shipped off to an institution.

Moore, who pondered possible sentences about two weeks, said Thursday he could not give probation to the suspect because of the actions taken to hide the crime. The body of Kerry Thomas, 11, was hidden in a hedgerow for four days.
