Police charge man with attempted murder

Dallas resident Than Quoc Pho, 18, was charged with two counts of criminal attempted murder Dec. 28 in connection with a shooting Christmas morning at the Quality Inn Convention Center, 215 East Airport Freeway.

Witnesses said Pho approached the victims, Vinh Nguyen, 32, of Carrollton, and Nhon Quang Bui, 28, of Grand Prairie, and shot them at close range with a .22 caliber pistol. Bui was shot once in the right ear-

lobe and Nguyen was shot three times in the back and left hand, police said.

~~Bui was treated at Parkland Memorial Hospital and released.~~ Nguyen is listed in stable condition.

The shootings could have been gang related, said investigator Sgt. Don Stephens. Pho is also wanted on homicide charges in New Jersey and federal grand larceny in New York, police said.
