Saginaw man fatally injured in construction accident

39-year-old

killed after

crane falls

on his chest

A 39-year-old man from Saginaw, Texas, was killed Thursday in a construction accident in which part of a crane fell on his chest, according to Irving police.

Donald Johnson and three other men were in the process of dismantling a crane and loading it onto a truck for transport in the 300 block of E. Las Colinas Boulevard at approximately 3 p.m., said David Tull, Public Information Officer at the Irving Police Department.

During the process, a section fell on him, Tull said.

"They were taking the boom off

the crane, and part of the boom gave way and rolled off the truck and onto the man," Tull said. "The part of the crane fell on his chest."

Police are ruling the incident as simply an "industrial accident," Tull said. Police have even concluded their investigation, he said.

Tull said he did not know the size or weight of the crane, although it was the "weight of the crane that caused the serious injuries that led to his death."

The actual accident occurred in the street, Tull said.

"They were in the process of dismantling it, but I don't know if they were done with their job or something was wrong with the crane," Tull said.

Irving Fire Department paramedics transported the victim to Parkland Memorial Hospital, where he was pronounced dead.

Johnson was working for a crane company out of Grand Prairie, but Tull said he did not know what Johnson's exact position was.

Woman dies in crash on freeway

A 51-year-old Fort Worth woman died in a four-vehicle accident Wednesday morning at Interstate 635 and State Highway 161.

Andra Jones was pronounced dead on arrival. Although three other cars were involved, there were no other injuries.

Jones was driving her white, four-door 1990 Cadillac eastbound on I-635 when her car struck a truck in front of her, causing her to lose control and hit two other cars and the guardrail, said David Tull, IPD public information officer.

No charges have been filed in the case.

"Police are continuing their investigation and still trying to pinpoint the exact cause or causes of the accident," Tull said.

The Dallas County Medical Examiner ruled Jones' death accidental and concluded the cause of death was a blunt force injury. Toxicology tests are being per-

formed but those results take eight weeks.

However, Tull said, there was no indication alcohol was involved, and high speeds also did not seem to be a factor.

Police received the call on the accident at 8:23 a.m. and found Jones' car near the SH-161 merger. At that point, Tull said, three lanes from I-635 merge with three lanes from SH 161. After they merge, the highway loses a lane, going from six to five in that area. Further on, one of the lanes turns into an exit-only lane for Luna Road and the highway is reduced to four lanes.

Where the two highways merge, an area is defined by a painted line that does not mark a lane but a median-like area, Tull said.

"A flatbed truck was in between these white lines of the merge but was not in a lane," Tull said. "I don't know if he was stopped or slowing down in that middle point, but the Cadillac came up behind the truck and went to cross over a lane and hit the back of the truck."

"It put her car out of control, which sent her back across three lanes of traffic."

In the process, Jones' car hit a smaller car and a small pickup and then hit the guardrail, he said.

"After hitting the guardrail, her car went 50 yards along the guardrail before coming to a stop," Tull said.

No one else was injured, but the highway was shut down for nearly four hours.

Jones' death marks the eighth traffic fatality in Irving this year; there have been six fatality accidents — two with multiple fatalities.

Last year there were 14 fatalities in 14 fatality traffic accidents.

Police anticipate this year's figures will turn out better than last year's, Tull said.

"We'd have to have quite a few accidents between now and the end of the year to reach last year's," Tull said. "We're hoping that won't be the case."

Children's access to loaded gun ends in 6-year-old's death

A 6-year-old Irving girl was killed Monday after she apparently activated a loaded gun at an apartment near her home.

Rebecca Julian, who was playing with her younger brother and a friend, was shot once in the chest with a 12-gauge shotgun. She was pronounced dead at the garage apartment in the 2400 block of Smith Avenue at 10:28 a.m.

The girl and her 5-year-old brother had been playing with a 6-year-old boy, a neighborn't supposed to go into the garage apartment."

According to Tull, the shotgun was leaning up against the wall. Police are uncertain which child took the gun, but all three were playing with it or, at least, looking at it, he said.

"When the gun accidentally discharged, she was in the line of fire," Tull said.

Neither the two children or the father of

adults in Texas will soon face stiff penalties for negligently leaving loaded guns within a child's reach.

Beginning Sept. 1, adults can be held liable if they negligently store a gun and a child gains access to it. An adult gun owner can be charged with a Class C misdemeanor if a child brandishes or displays a gun, and if the child fires the gun

and injures or kills someone, the charge can be a Class A misdemeanor, punishable by a \$4,000 fine and up to a year in jail.

Tull said this is the type of incident that teaches everyone a lesson.

"It's a tragedy, and it touches everyone," Tull said. "A lot of people have children and also have guns in their homes. We need to watch how we handle them and where we put them. Nobody should have to go through something like that."

Police refer gun case to grand jury

Irving police have asked a Dallas County grand jury to decide whether an Irving man whose gun was responsible for the death of 6-year-old girl should be indicted on injury-to-a-child charges.

Rebecca Julian of Irving was killed on the morning of July 17 while playing with her 5-year-old brother and at the home of a 6-year-old friend, the son of the gun owner. Julian was shot once in the chest with the man's 12-gauge shotgun.

Injury to a child is a Class A misdemeanor and carries a possible sentence of up to one year in jail and/or a \$4,000 fine. Police would not release the man's name until all the paperwork is filed.

"We haven't filed the case outright," said Lt. Sid Fuller of the Ir-

ving Police Department.

Fuller said the question that needed to be answered was whether the gun owner was criminally negligent.

"We're letting the grand jury decide because it's a question of whether the law was violated," Fuller said. "Under injury to a child, they will determine if there was criminal negligence involved. That's what injury to a child is based on."

A new law specifically designed to enable authorities to prosecute gun owners who allow their weapons into the hands of children does not take effect until Sept. 1.

The friend and his father were living in a garage apartment in the 2400 block of Smith Avenue, according to police. The children found the shotgun leaning against a wall, said David Tull, IPD public information officer.

"The father of the friend was at work, and the kids went into the residence," Tull said. "They had been playing elsewhere, and they weren't supposed to go into the garage apartment."

Police are uncertain which child took the gun. All three were playing with it or looking at it, he said.

"When the gun accidentally discharged, she was in the line of fire," Tull said.

Under the new law, an adult gun owner can be charged with a Class C misdemeanor, punishable up to a \$500 fine, if a child brandishes or displays a gun. If the child actually fires the gun and injures or kills someone, the charge can be a Class A misdemeanor, punishable by a \$4,000 fine and up to a year in jail. Grand jury no-bills owner of gun that killed child

A Dallas County grand jury on Thursday failed to indict an Irving man whose shotgun was found by his son and two neighborhood children, one of whom died when the weapon accidentally discharged.

Pablo Mercado, 24, was no billed on injury-to-a-child charges after a grand jury reviewed the

case filed by the Irving Police Department.

Rebecca Julian, 6, of Irving, was shot once in the chest with Mercado's 12-gauge shotgun while playing at 10:28 a.m. July 17 with her 5-year-old brother and a 6-year-old friend, Mercado's son.

Police did not file charges out-
