# Rescued motorist dies at hospital

Emergency crews' attempts to save a 21-year-old Irving motorist's life Friday by amputating his leg were unsuccessful. Jimmy Dewayne Nash died shortly after he was flown by a Care-

Flight helicopter to Parkland Memorial Hospital.

Nash had crashed his 1989 Ford Taurus into a utility pole near Conflans Road and Olde Town Drive about 3:59 a.m. Friday. Before Nash was flown to the hospital, a surgeon was brought to the accident scene to amputate one of his legs so he could be removed from his mangled vehicle.

"The car was wrapped all the way around the pole," said accident investigator Rocky Bailey of the Irving Police Department. "The driver's seat was basically moved into the passenger's seat. The car sort of collapsed around him. The distance between the right side of the car and the left side of the car was about 18 inches."

Irving public information officer David Tull described the car as being in the shape of the letter C. "It was unbelievable," Tull said.

"They cut off everything they could cut off, but they just couldn't get to him. It was a life-

threatening situation. If they left him in the car and tried much longer, he could've died (at the scene)."

According to Tull, efforts to get the driver out by usual means failed. The fire department first tried unsuccessfully to use its "jaws of life" equipment and then tried to cut parts off of car, Tull said.

"They cut off everything they could cut off, but they just couldn't get to him," Tull said. "It was a life-threatening situation. If they left him in the car and tried much

longer, he could've died (at the scene)."

Nash was heading westbound on Conflans Road, where the road drops off a hill and curves to the right. Nash's excessive speed apparently caused the accident.

"He spun back to the right and hit the pole," Tull said. "Evidently, his car spun or at least started to swerve."
