5-year-old killed crossing street

A 5-year-old Irving boy was killed Saturday when he stepped in front of a car traveling along MacArthur Boulevard in Valley Ranch.

Evidio Morejon was walking on a sidewalk ahead of his guardian in the 10400 block of North MacArthur Boulevard when he darted out into traffic, police said.

"We don't know whether he was with a family friend or a relative, but the boy was with an adult who was his guardian," Tull said. "The boy was attempting to cross the street near Cowboy Parkway and MacArthur Boulevard when he was hit by the car."

According to Tull, the car was traveling southbound on MacArthur Boulevard just south of the Cowboy Parkway intersection.

An 18-year-old Colleyville man was the driver of the car. Tull said police do not plan to file any

charges against him.

"There were several witnesses there, and they all said it happened so quickly," Tull said.

"The driver didn't have enough reaction time to avoid the accident. Also, speed was not a factor, and the roadways were dry."

Morejon was taken to R.H. Dedmon Hospital in Dallas, where he was pronounced dead.

Tull said it is difficult to see how this incident could have been prevented.

"I'm sure he was told not to cross the street without looking both ways," Tull said, "and that's what makes it an accident. I guess parents just need to tell their kids from the time they're able to walk to look before crossing because cars can hit you."

Tull said he also thinks the fact that the child lived in Valley Ranch could be a factor.

"They weren't far from home," Tull said, "and that's where people's apprehensions are down. People are usually more cautious in strange territory."
