ADAM, M.D., MAURICE 83, of Dallas, born July 19, 1921 in Guayaquil, Equador to Leon Emile Maurice Adam of Mauritius and Elizabeth Zuleika Corley Adam of Mexia, Texas, died of adenoidal cystic cancer on July 3, 2005. After graduating from Highland Park, he received a Mechanical Engineering degree from the University of Texas in Austin where he was President of the Delta Tau Delta fraternity. He served as a Naval Lieutenant (J.G.) in the Asian Pacific theatre. He graduated from UT Medical Branch-Galveston in 1951, having married Doris Depenbrock Adam, a pediatrician, in 1949. After surgery residencies in Galveston and New Orleans and as a Fellow of the NIH at Tulane, he began his 34 year cardiothoracic surgery practice in Dallas in 1959. He performed his first open heart surgeries that year, implanted the first permanent pacemaker in 1960, and began coronary bypass grafts in 1968. At one time, his practice performed more multiple bypass grafts than any other practice in the country. He was Director of Thoracic Surgery, Children's Medical, Dallas 1972-1983; Chief of Thoracic Surgery, Baylor Hospital, Dallas 1986-1991; Chairman - Society of Thoracic Surgeons Committee on Standards & Ethics, and Clinical Professor of Surgery, UT SW Health Science Center. He assisted his partner in establishing the Baylor Heart & Lung Transplantation Service. At the age of 50, he became an avid tennis player and played until last year. He enjoyed studying French and traveling (most often to France), snow skiing and golf, and especially relaxing on the deck of his vacation home by the river in Cuchara, CO. He was a member of St Michael and All Angels Episcopal Church for 46 years (serving on the Vestry for 5 years), Northwood Club, and Hidden Hill, where many life long friends were made. He was preceded in death by his first wife of 43 years, Doris Depenbrock Adam and sister, Antoinette Adam West.
