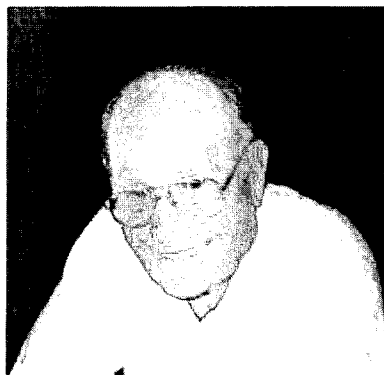

David Ronnie Huckaby (March 20, 1944 – July 1, 2010)

David Ronnie Huckaby, 66, of Plano, died July 1, at Baylor Medical Center Dallas after a battle with cancer.

Born March 20, 1944 Dallas, Tx, to Arnon and Lucile (Boatman) Huckaby. Siblings included Wanda Ruth Burns, Helen Lee Asbury, Donald Keith Huckaby, Joyce Jean Aver, Glenda Huckaby, Bessie Earlene Jones, and Carolyn Faye Nally.

On September 1, 1967 he married Sheila H. White at Spring Valley Methodist church, Richardson, Tx.

He graduated from Irving High School in 1962, received his BS Electrical Engineering from UT Arlington and an MBA in Business at University of Dallas in Irving.

David worked in computers, specializing in credit card detection fraud systems. He saw the evolution of computers first hand—from enormous mainframes with specialized rooms to wifi connections and telecommuting. At the time of his death, he was employed by Bank of America in Addison, Texas as Vice President in the Credit Card processing area. Previously he worked for Texas Instruments, Bank Tech, Wells Fargo and MBNA.

While working for Texas Instruments in the early 1970s, David and family lived in Aalsmeer in the Netherlands for two years. He and Sheila traveled extensively during this time: England, Ireland, France, Germany, and Belgium.

For several years, David worked as a volunteer at Heritage Farmstead Museum in Plano. Under the auspices of his company, DRH Software Services, he developed a software package, CATdb, for inventorying and tracking over 4,000 artifacts at the museum. For this work, he received an award from the Volunteer Center of Collin County at their annual award ceremony in April 1997.

Huckaby and Boatman genealogy was a passion for David. After educating himself on strategies and techniques of genealogical research, he undertook trips to Mississippi, Arkansas, Oklahoma and East Texas. On a recent trip to England, fulfilling a long-time wish, David was able to see the Huckaby hamlet that dated from the 1600s.

Outside of work, David enjoyed nature in every form, particularly waterfalls, birds, squirrel antics and beautiful flowering plants and trees. In addition, he enjoyed learning Spanish, playing classical guitar, archeology/paleontology, and Ken Follet novels.

Survivors include his wife, son Thomas D. Huckaby, daughter Dawn M. Caldwell and son-in-law Douglas Caldwell, grandchildren Mason J. Caldwell and K. Nicole Caldwell and sister B. Earlene Jones.

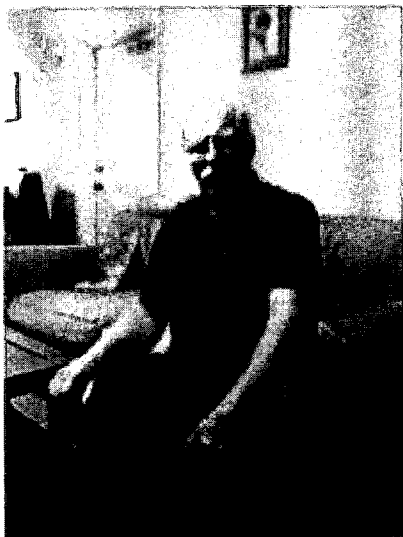
