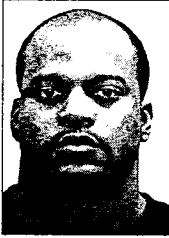

## Sample charged with murder

Shooting: 12-28-10 at 1:24 p.m. Police received a 911 call reporting a shooting in the 4000 block of Avalon Avenue. When officers arrived they found a male lying on the ground suffering from multiple gunshot wounds. The male was transported to Parkland Hospital where he was later pronounced dead. The victim has been identified as 29-year-old Tyvanti Johnson of Irving. Based on initial statements it appears as if the victim was standing in the street and involved in an argument when he was shot. A suspect vehicle was seen leaving the scene. Through statements and witness testimony, 14-year-old Mark Antonio Sample has been arrested and charged with Murder. The investigation is ongoing and additional suspects may be identified in the process.
