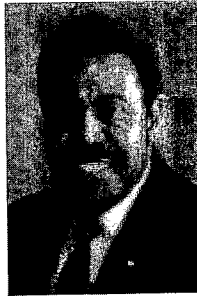

Yates, Fletcher A. (1935 - 2010)



Fletcher A. Yates, Sr., age 74, a resident of Irving, Texas for 35 years died Monday, June 21, 2010 at Baylor Medical Center at Irving. Fletcher was born November 26, 1935 in Lawrenceburg, Indiana to Robert and Alice Ware Yates.

Fletcher graduated from Lockland Wayne High School in Cincinnati, Ohio in 1953. He attended Tennessee State University in Nashville, Tennessee and the University of Cincinnati in Ohio where he earned an Associates Degree.

In 1953 Fletcher was a member of the Ohio State Champions Basketball Team and a member of an undefeated football team. He was the All Tournament 1st Team scorer, was on the All City Enquirer and Post Newspaper team and elected to the 1st Team All State, and the south All Star 1st Team. He was the second leading scorer in the city Fletcher was also a member of the AAU State Champs as a player and coach.

Fletcher served two years in Korea and received All Army 1st Team in Basketball honors. In 1979, he toured Taiwan, China as part of the American Baseball Federation. Fletcher gave many hours of service in coaching girls, boys, and men in basketball and baseball. He was selected as one of the "Top 50 Players Who Left Their Mark" as featured in the Cincinnati Post on December 10, 1999

Fletcher moved to Irving, Texas and made his mark of distinction in a variety of ways. He was a member of Plymouth Park Baptist Church. Fletcher was a member of the Irving Symphony Board and vice-president for two years. He was a member of the Independent Bank Board for five years. Fletcher served on the Health Care Executive Forum through the Irving Independent School's Needs Assessment Committee and was a Dallas County School Board member for 14 years. He served as a member of the North Texas Council of Governors for 10 years, the Texas Educational Black Caucus for 10 years and as the District 10 Representative of the Texas Educational Association for 14 years. He was a member of the Texas Association of School Boards for 10 years and served on the State National Pupil Transportation board for 10 years. He was a member of the Metro African American School Board Association for five years. He served on the Bear Creek Development Corporation Board for 15 years. He was President of the Irving Black Arts Council for five years. He was a founding member of the NAACP Irving, Texas Branch and served as Vice President and Executive Vice-President. In 1989, Fletcher received the Irving, Texas High Spirited Citizens Award and the DECT Silent Hero Award in 2007 for his tireless work in the community.

After 32 years of nearly perfect attendance, Fletcher retired from American Airlines where he worked as a Supervisor of Passenger Service training and evaluating Agents to prepare them to be successful in the workplace

Fletcher leaves to rejoice in the memory of his life: his wife of 49 years, Ginny S. Zacharias, David David Zacharias, 95, died on December 15 2010. Memorial Service Sunday December 19, 2010, 3:00 p.m. at NorthPark Presbyterian Church (N. Central Express between Walnut Hill and Park Lane) David was born in Pittsburgh, PA and was a graduate of the University of Pittsburgh and Western Theological Seminary (now Pittsburgh Theological). He was ordained as a Presbyterian minister in 1945. Early in his ministerial career he served two churches in New Mexico. In 1948, he became the organizing pastor of Westminster Presbyterian Church in Lubbock, TX, a congregation which grew to approximately 1000

members by the time he left in 1961. From 1961-1965, David served as associate pastor at First Presbyterian Church in Dallas, TX; then at Dallas' NorthPark Presbyterian Church from 1965 until his retirement in 1980. Upon his retirement he was named Pastor Emeritus of NorthPark Church. Rev. Zacharias was active in the life of the Church at the local, state, and national levels. He served as moderator of Grace Presbytery and served on various committees throughout his ministry. He also served as a faithful member of the Synod of the Sun. He was a pioneer in establishing Older Adult ministries, leading and teaching conferences at the local, state, and national level. David had a passion for the environment and felt strongly that we all must be stewards of God's earth. He started a NorthPark Conservation Society. He was one of the founders and the first president of Save Open Spaces (SOS). Representing SOS he served on a Dallas city committee that developed standards for a sign ordinance in Dallas.
