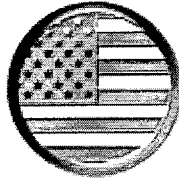

James Young(1921 - 2013)



Young, James "Jim" Whitehurst James "Jim" Whitehurst Young, a long-time resident of Irving, Texas, passed away November 29, 2013 surrounded by his wife, children and grandchildren. Jim was born January 26, 1921 in Coffeyville, Kansas to George and Marie (Forbes) Young. He and Margaret Maddux married in 1943 and celebrated their 70th wedding anniversary this past June. While at Coffeyville Junior College, Jim participated in a government-sponsored pilot training program, which led to his first job as a civilian flight instructor with the U.S. military. In 1941, he enlisted in the U.S. Navy and served in World War II as a naval aviator, flight instructor and ferry pilot. He earned the rank of Lieutenant SG and left active duty with the WWII Victory Medal after serving at multiple air bases, including Pensacola, Florida and the USNAS, Corpus Christi. Jim graduated from Sul Ross State University and ultimately pursued a career with Dresser Industries that spanned more

than three decades. As a senior research scientist and chief engineer, he earned numerous patents for his oil field equipment designs. Athletic and competitive, Jim played tennis well into his eighties. Off court, he was known for his inventive spirit, his wit, his storytelling skills and his love of a well-timed pun. Jim was an avid traveler and reader, but nothing thrilled him more than spending quality "ranch time" with his family and friends. He is survived by his loving family: wife, Margaret Young, and his children, son Stan Young and wife Camille of Houston, son Jeff Young and wife Debbie of Meridian, and daughter Kathryn Warren and her husband Bill of Dallas.
