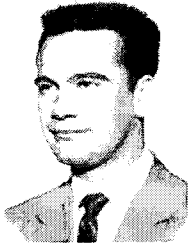

Wayne (Amos) Alan Story

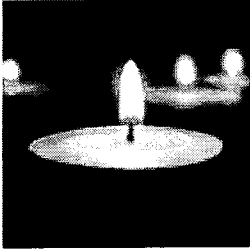
September 3, 1971 - May 26, 2014

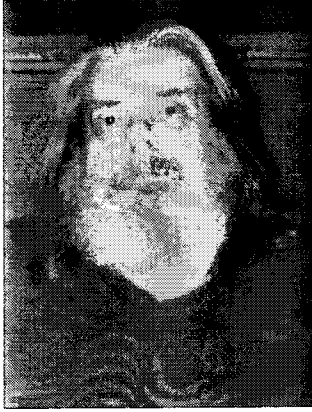

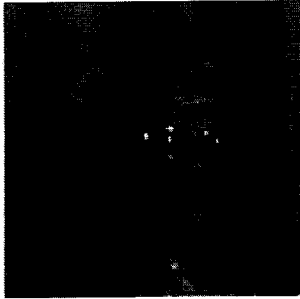
