


Are your prescription medicines covered?



Check the **Balanced** drug list to see if your medicines are covered.

Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Texas (BCBSTX) is always looking for ways to help you save money. One easy way to save is to use a drug on the BCBSTX drug list.

With your BCBSTX plan, your drug list is called **Balanced**.

When you use a drug on your drug list, your copay/insurance (what you pay out of pocket) will usually be lower. You can still fill prescriptions for drugs that are not on your drug list, but you will pay more.

How to find a drug on the drug list that's right for you:

- 1 Visit **MyPrime.com** and sign in — or register if you don't already have an account.
- 2 Select **Find Medicines** to see if your medicine is covered.
- 3 If your medicine isn't covered, talk to your doctor about therapeutic alternatives. Your doctor can also request a coverage exception from BCBSTX (unless you have a benefit exclusion).
- ? If you have questions about your pharmacy benefit, please call the toll-free number listed on your member ID card.

Important to note: Treatment decisions are always between you and your doctor. Talk with your doctor about any questions or concerns you have about medicines you are prescribed.

Coverage is subject to the limitations and exclusions noted in your plan materials. For some medicines, you must meet certain criteria before prescription drug benefit coverage may be approved.

Note: If you had a prior authorization approval for a drug that is now no longer covered, your doctor can submit a coverage exception request to Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Texas. See your plan materials for details.
