Description

Sally Belle Pearson Elliott was born in Oklahoma on February 20, 1904, and grew up in McKinney, Texas. She attended North Texas Teachers College (University of North Texas) and began her teaching career in McKinney. In 1923, she moved to the Irving area and began teaching in the Shady Grove School #2. She married Sam Houston Elliott, a member of an Irving area pioneer family, in 1925. She took a few years off, then returned to teaching in the Irving school district. She taught for 32 years before retiring in 1965. The Irving Independent School District named an elementary school in her honor.
