Description

The Heritage House was originally the C. P. Schulze family home. The house was constructed in 1912 for C. P. Schulze, his wife Virginia Tucker Schulze, and their two children Mary and Charles. C.P. Schulze died in 1957. Virginia Schulze lived in the house until her death in 1966. In 1975, the Schulze children, Mary and Charles, donated the house to the city of Irving as part of the local Bicentennial events. The house was refurbished in the style of the early 1900s and opened as a house museum. The file contains a copy of a handwritten history of the house and the Schulze family in Texas; photocopies of photos of the interior and exterior of the house as part of the historic marker application; and articles from the mid-to-late-1970s on the Heritage House. The file also contains a photocopy of a 1948 newspaper documenting an event held at the house. Three pictures of the interior of the house accompany the article.
